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What is Title I:

Seminole County Public Schools (SCPS) receives an annual allocation of federal dollars to provide additional resources to schools that have high percentages of children who qualify for free or reduced-priced lunch.

Currently, 12 elementary schools, four middle schools, three special centers, one charter school and 13 non-public schools are receiving supplemental resources through Title I, Part A
